I hope everyone was able to find a way to see the Facebook recording of the worship service last week. Pastor Nick read an awesome Psalm and intro'd the service. Jeff and Daniel brought us some really well-chosen

songs with lyrics scrolling, and the message was from Mark 4, "Jesus Calms the Storm." It was a blessing to be a part of the ministry. The Facebook stats show over 3,500 reached and over 1,800 views on the service, so it seems like it got pretty good traction. However, it would make a huge impact if several more of you who are highly active on Facebook decided to "share" the service next week. It is a small thing that can make a big difference. So, the plan going forward is to stream a digital service again this weekend. And then mid to late next week re-assess where things stand and listen carefully to the directives coming from state health officials. So please stay tuned. Unfortunately, it does appear the social distancing is likely to continue for at least another month or more.

I have asked the staff to pass this message along to all ministries and committees they liaison with: "I urge all staff, committees and ministries of Salem to go into full austerity mode immediately. Please curtail any and all spending, save what is only absolutely essential. We can push back scheduled projects, repairs and updates. Hold off on planned purchases, and adjust all thermostats in our mostly empty buildings to start with."

Together we can weather this storm. Also, we urge those who are able, to continue to graciously give of tithes and offerings. With the social distancing going on all around us, resulting from viral spread precautions, it had me thinking about finding any silver linings I could in the situation. Here are a few I came up with:

- We have a chance to re-learn the doctrine of the Church. Church is not an address, edifice, or institution it is the Body of Christ in the world, being salt and light;
- 2. These times also give us the chance to be a good neighbor. Instead of buying two years' worth of toilet paper we can buy two weeks' worth and leave some for our neighbors. We can support local and small businesses. We can look after the elderly in our flock and in our neighborhoods and make sure they are well supplied.
- 3. These times could help us re-connect with family. Take small day trips somewhere, bust out the board games, gather in small huddles with your BFG groups, do a home improvement project together, serve someone in the neighborhood.

Whatever we do with our time, let's try to help one another not give in to worry and fear. These times will pass, and God will not put more on you than you can bear. If you hear about a Salem person in crisis, PLEASE LET US KNOW IMMEDIATELY!

Thank you for all you do for the Kingdom of God here at Salem and beyond.

- 1. Enter the giving amount
- 2. Select a fund (General, Annie Armstrong, etc.)
- 3. Click on "+ add more" if you would like to give to more than one fund.
- 4. Enter your email address
- 5. You may continue as a "guest", enter your password if you have already set up an ACS account, or confirm your email to create an account. (Creating an account allows you to save payments, set up a recurring gift, make changes to your profile information, edit registrations, and view your giving information anytime by logging in to your account from our website link.)
- 6. Select a frequency for the gift (one time, once a month, etc.) and an effective date.
- 7. Enter your account information (Credit/Debit Card, Checking or Savings).
- 8. Select "Give"
